49 Old Barrenjoey Road, Avalon Beach


Sabiang's menu is designed to be shared in the traditional Thai style with delicious entrées, multiple mains or noodles and rice. Sabiang has something for everyone.

ESSENTIALS

BREAD AND PASTRIES

There are two excellent bakeries in Avalon Village – La Banette on Avalon Parade and Bonfire Bakery on Old Barrenjoey Road (those streets are the two main roads of Avalon Village).

AVALON ORGANICS

WOOLWORTHS METRO

There is a great old-school butcher shop on Avalon Parade called Avalon Village Meats opposite Mitre 10.

ACTIVITIES


Bangalley Headland Walk:

Great coastline views south to Sydney and north to Broken Bay and the Central Coast. The Headland is the highest point on Sydney's northern coastline. The entrance to the coastal path is nearby, an easy 10-min walk from the Cottage. Turn left from the front gate, take the second right at Urara Road then left onto Marine Parade down to the coastal path between 2 Watkins and 97 Marine Parade. Signs and route markings start from there. Even the first part is worth the trip!

Barrenjoey Lighthouse Walk & Summer Bay:

A bit further afield is the famous Barrenjoey Lighthouse at Palm Beach. The lighthouse is one of the most iconic sights on Sydney's northern beaches. Built in 1881 from sandstone quarried on site, the lighthouse, its oil room and keepers' cottages remain unpainted in the original stone finish.

There is a parking area at Governor Phillip Park at Palm Beach (drive north to the end of the road!) and from there the walk is about 30mins each way, whether by the main route or you could choose to walk Smugglers Track instead, for a more challenging hike to the top. The name comes from customs officers who built the track to monitor smugglers bringing contraband into Broken Bay around 1850. Smugglers Track offers a steeper and shorter trek up to the lighthouse, but it's well worth the effort.







ACTIVITIES

Pittwater Ferries:

The wharf at Palm Beach (opp Barrenjoey House) has regular ferry departures to the Central Coast (Ettalong and Patonga) and to the small communities on the western shores of Pittwater like the Basin and Mackerel Beach.

The Basin roundtrip is fun and a great way just to see what the little bays around Pittwater are like. It takes about 45mins in total and the whole area is beautiful. Fantasea.com.au There is a Boathouse Group bar and restaurant at Patonga which can be a fun day trip for lunch. Ferries from the same wharf, boathouseferryco.com.au

Paradise Beach Pool:

At the bottom of Paradise Avenue in Avalon is a stunning little spot with a recently renovated shark-netted swimming pool on Pittwater. When the ocean beach is too windy from nor'-easters or southerlies, this secret location is worth the short drive.
